10 Numeracy credits and **10 Literacy credits**.

Internal and External Assessment



- An **Internally Assessed Standard (Int)** means the assessment is carried out in school.
 - Internal Assessments are marked by teachers at Rosmini College and then checked by NZQA.
- An **Externally Assessed Standard (Ext)** means the assessment is carried out by an examination at the end of the year or through work completed during the year submitted as a portfolio.
 - External assessments are set and marked by NZQA.

Endorsement - Subject



- To gain a **Subject Endorsement** you need to gain **14 credits** at **Achieved or higher** within one subject for that year.
- 3 of the 14 credits must come from internally assessed standards and 3 of the 14 credits must come from externally assessed standards.

Endorsement - NCEA Overall



- To gain an **NCEA Merit Endorsement** you need to gain **50** of your **80** credits at **Merit** level or higher.
- To gain an **NCEA Excellence Endorsement** you needs to gain **50** of your **80** credits at **Excellence**.

University Entry



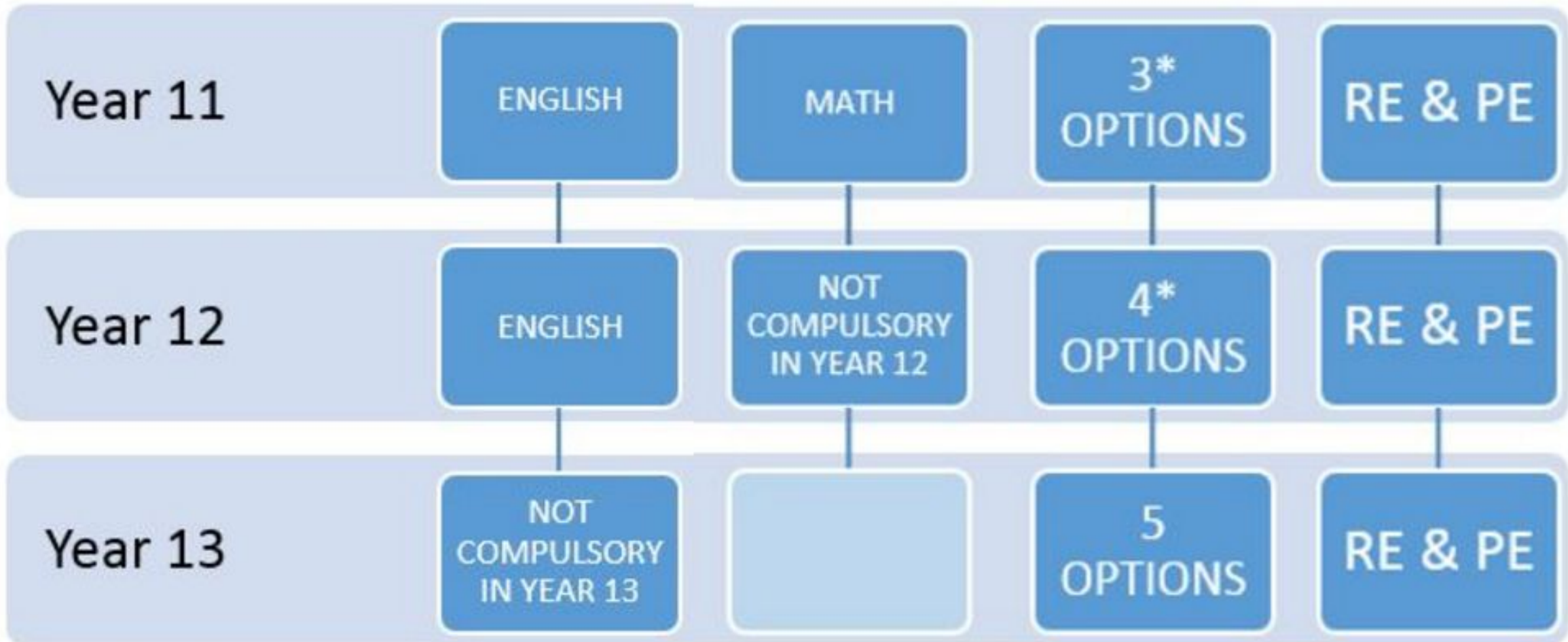
Minimum Entry:

- Level 3 NCEA
- 14 Credits or higher in 3 subjects (UE approved) at Level 3.
- Maths: at least 10 Credits at Level 1 (from specified standards)
- English: at least 10 Credits at Level 2 or 3 (5 in reading and 5 in writing from specified standards)

Limited Entry University Courses:

- GPA can be important
- Specific subjects may be required

- **Sciences:** General, Biology, Chemistry, Physics, Earth and Space (L 2-3)
- **Social Sciences:** Geography, History, Classical Studies (L2 & 3)
- **The Arts:** Art, Drama, Music
- **Technology:** Food Technology, Technology, Design and Visual Communication, Digital Technology, Mechanical Engineering (L2 & 3)
- **Commerce:** Economics, Accounting, Business Studies (L 3)
- **Physical Education:** Academic PE L1,2,3/Outdoor Education (L1 & 2)
- **Languages:** Maori, French, Japanese

Level 1 (Year 11) Courses

- Students are able to select 3 subjects and 1 backup/ reserve subject.
- RE/ Health, PE and English and Maths are compulsory and will be automatically selected.
 - *For English and Maths there is an alternative pathway for students who need targeted support. Parents/ caregivers and students will be contacted during Term 4 regarding this.*
- A Science is not compulsory but is recommended.

Level 2 (Year 12) Courses

- Students are able to select 4 subjects and 1 backup/ reserve subject/
- RE/ Health, PE and English are compulsory and will be automatically selected.
- Mathematics is not compulsory but is recommended.

Level 3 (Year 13) Courses

All Year 13 students are required to study **FIVE subjects** as well as R.E and P.E.

The majority of students in Year 13 will be attempting to gain University Entrance and NCEA Level 3.

For this reason, before choosing Level 3 subjects, students and parents should look at the Level 3 subjects, and ensure if university is a consideration for the future, that **4** of the options chosen are **university approved (Gateway and**

Students select **THREE options and ONE backup option**

Please note that the backup option may be a subject that students do end up taking in 2023.

Level 1 (Year 11)

- Students are able to select **THREE** subjects and 1 backup/ reserve subject.
- RE/ PE, English and Mathematics are compulsory and will be automatically selected.

Level 2 (Year 12)

- Students are able to select **FOUR** subjects and 1 backup/ reserve subject.
- RE/PE and English are compulsory and will be automatically selected.
- Mathematics is not compulsory but is recommended.

Level 3 (Year 13)

All Year 13 students are required to study **FIVE** subjects as well as RE/PE.
